AGLAIA – Pink shading to a darker almost Wine-colored center. Medium to large, peony. Vigorous spreading growth. (U.S. 1995 – Bobby Green, Green Nurseries, Fairhope, AL).

AGNES MORRIS - Light Pink. Miniature to small, rose form double. Rapid, upright, average growth. E. (U.S. 1997 – Mr. & Mrs. Walter L. Morris, Atlanta, GA)

AGNES O. SOLOMON - Light Pink. Loose semidouble to peony form with wavy petals. (U.S. 1953 – Orton Plantation, Winnabow, NC).

ALABAMA BEAUTY – Deep Magenta-Red. Large, semidouble. Vigorous, upright growth. E-M. (U.S. – Tom Dodd, Jr., Semmes, AL).

ALBERT RAYMOND - Deep Pink toned Purple on the edges. Medium semidouble. Upright spreading growth. (Australia 2006 - Albert Raymond & Gwenda Norris, QLD).

ALBINO - White. Miniature, formal double. Vigorous, upright dense growth. L. (U.S. 1999 – Dr. Leland Chow, Bakersfield, CA).

ALICE C - Pink. Large, single. Medium, bushy growth, E. (Australia, 1991 – John Alpen, Newport Beach, NSW)

ALISON SPRAGG - Rose Pink. Medium, semidouble to peony form. Vigorous, upright growth. E-L. (Australia, 1973 – Alice Spragg, Sutherland, NSW).

ANGEL'S KISS – Medium Pink. Medium, peony form. Rapid growth. E. (U.S. 2008 – Camellia Forest Nursery, Chapel Hill, NC).

ANN'S WELCOME – White. Medium, single. Strong, compact growth. (C sasanqua 'Edna Butler' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Craig Carroll, Carroll's Country Gardens & Nursery, Mt Tomah, NSW).

APHRODITE – White edged Magenta Pink, often with Peach-Pink bud center. Medium, rose form double. Petals are wavy and ruffled edged. Upright, dense growth. E-M. (C. sasanqua 'Mine-no-yuki' x unknown pollen parent). (U.S. 2005 – Robert Green of Green Nurseries, Fairhope, AL).

APPLE-BLOSSOM - White blushed Pink with dark Yellow anthers and filaments. Medium, single. Fragrant. E. (U.S. about 1921 – Coolidge Gardens, Pasadena, CA)

ARTEL - Deep Red. Medium, semidouble. Upright open growth. E M. (Australia 1974 – Alice Spragg, Sutherland, NSW).

ASAKURA - White shaded Pink. Large, semidouble. E. (Japan, 1974 Shunsuke Hisatomi – Kurume, Fukuoda Prefecture).

AUNT ALMA – Medium Pink. Small, peony form. Medium, upright, open growth. E. (U.S. 1975 – Charles R. Phillips, Columbia, SC).

AUTUMN DAWN - White with edges toned deeper Pink. Medium, loose peony. U.S. 1994 – Nuccio's Nursery, Altadena CA).

AUTUMN DELIGHT - White with blush Pink at edge with Yellow anthers and Pink filaments. Medium, rose form double. Vigorous, upright and dense growth. E. (U.S. 2000 – Dr. James Habel, Suffolk, VA).

AUTUMN MOON - White. Medium, single with very thick petals. Rapid, upright, dense growth. E. (U.S. 1961 – K. Sawada, Overlook Nursery, AL).

AUTUMN ROCKET – White with Yellow Anthers and White filaments. Medium, anemone to rose form double. Vigorous, columnar, dense growth, E. (U.S. 2000 – Dr. James Habel, Suffolk, VA).

AUTUMN SENTINEL – Clear Pink. Miniature, peony to rose form double. Vigorous, very upright, dense growth. E. (U.S. 1999 – Green Nursery, Fairhope, AL).

AUTUMN SUN - Rose Red. Semidouble. Upright, very compact dense growth. E-M. (U.S, 2008- Parks).

AUTUMN SUNRISE - **White with a Red tip on each petal.** Cup-shaped, large single. Vigorous, dense and upright growth habit. (U.S. 2008 - Parks).

AUTUMN SURPRISE - Delicate Pink with Yellow anthers and White filaments. Miniature, semidouble to peony form. Upright growth; good for espalier. E. (U.S. 1966 – A Rester, Bogalusa, LA).

AVRIL CARR – White with a light Red tinge on the back of the outer petals. Medium, semidouble. Upright, dense growth. (C.sasanqua 'Narumigata' x C.sasanqua 'Mine-no-yuki'). (Australia 1992 – Alice Spragg, Sutherland, NSW).

AWAKE - Rosy Pink, sometimes shading lighter toward center. Medium, semidouble. Upright, open growth. E-M. (Australia 1980 - Alice Spragg, Sutherland, NSW).

BAYOU DREAM – Rosine Purple. Miniature, semidouble with inner petals rabbit eared. Slow, upright, compact growth. E. (C. sasanqua 'Rosea' x unknown pollen parent). (U.S. 1951 – J. S. Bradford, Ocean Springs, MS).

BE MY CHERIE - Deep Red merging into at base with White based Red petaloids. Medium, anemone form. Upright, dense growth. (C.sasanqua 'Cherilyn' x C.sasanqua 'Beatrice Emily'). (Australia – 1978 – Alice Spragg, Sutherland, NSW).

BEATRICE EMILY - Violet Red with White petaloid center. Medium, anemone form. (Australia 1957 –

- BENI ZAKURA (RED CHERRY)** – Crimson. Medium, single, Higo type. (Japan 1971 – Kumamoto Prefecture).
- BERT JONES** – Pink to Silvery Pink. Medium to large semidouble. Upright growth. E-M. (Australia 1958 - Bert Jones - St Ives, NSW).
- BETH LENNARD** - Phlox Pink petaloids with Fuchsia Purple outer petals with White anthers and Yellow filaments. Small, rose form double. Slow, open, spreading growth. (New Zealand 1986 - T. Lennard, Te Puke).
- BETSY BAKER** - Light Silver Pink. Miniature to small, rose form double with ruffled petals. Rapid, average growth. E. (C. sasanqua 'Mine-no-yuki' x unknown pollen parent) (U.S. 1956 - Elizabeth W. Hicklin, SC).
- BETTIE PATRICIA** - Persian Rose. Medium, rose form double. Rapid, upright, open growth. E. (U.S. 1957 - S.D. Coleman, GA).
- BETTYE JO** - White. Medium, formal double with petals cleft and slightly incurved. (U.S. 1967 - Howard E. Burnette, California).
- BEWITCHED** - Rose Pink with Yellow anthers and White filaments. Small, semidouble. Medium, upright, spreading, open growth. E. (U.S. 1969 - Harold Cawood, GA).
- BLUSH ROSETTE** – Very light Blush Pink. Miniature to small, rose form double to loose peony. Upright, spreading growth. L. (Sport of 'C. sasanqua 'Rosette'). (U.S. 1994 - Nuccio's Nurseries, Altadena, CA).
- BONANZA** - Deep Red with Yellow stamens. Medium, semi-peony form. Rapid, upright, dense growth. (C. sasanqua 'Crimson Tide' x unknown pollen parent). (U.S. 1962 - Tom Dodd, Jr., Semmes, AL).
- BOOM-A-LOOM** - Pale Pink border shading into White with Yellow stamens. , Medium to large semidouble with crinkled petals, those in center upright. Rapid, upright growth. E. (U.S. 1967 - Gary Chitty LeCroy, SC).
- BRANDY'S TEMPER** – Red. Semidouble. Erect growth. E. (U.S. - Tom Dodd, Jr., Semmes, AL).
- BRIAR ROSE** – Deep Pink to Purplish Pink. Medium to large. (U.S. 1927 - Coolidge Rare Plant Gardens, East Pasadena, CA).
- BRILLIANCY** – Bright Cherry Red. Large, single. (U.S. 1933 – K. Sawada, Crichton, AL).
- BROOKSIE ANDERSON** - Light Orchid Pink. Miniature, rose form double. Slow, compact growth. E. (U.S. 1962 – R. E. May)
- BUTLER'S BEAUTY** – Pink to Lavender Pink at edges. Medium, semidouble rose form double. Vigorous, upright growth. E. (U.S. 2003 - Robert W. Butler, Hilton Head Island, SC
- BUTTERCUP** – Crimson Rose with Golden Yellow stamens. Miniature. Upright, slightly arching growth. (U.S.).
- CALLIOPE** – White edged and suffused Pink. Miniature, loose peony to rose form double.
- CAMILLIA BEASLEY** - Pink with sheen. Medium to large semidouble. Vigorous, upright spreading dense growth. E-M. (U.S. 1994 - Marvin Jernigan, Warner Robins, GA).
- CANDY REITER** – Shell Pink with Rose Pink margins with light Brown anthers and light Green filaments. Medium to large single. Medium, dense, upright growth. E. (U.S. 1947 - McCaskill Gardens, Pasadena, CA).
- CANDYBALL** – White Blush Pink. Medium formal double aging to informal double. Upright, bushy growth. (C. sasanqua 'Jenifer Susan' x unknown pollen plant). (Australia 2001 - Justin O'Malley Jones, Marian Grove Nursery, Mangrove Mountain, NSW).
- CAROLYN ANDERTON** - White flushed Pink with Golden Yellow anthers and Cream filaments. Medium, semidouble. Rapid, spreading growth. Fragrant. E-M. (New Zealand 1995 - C. Anderton, Tauranga).
- CAVALIER'S LADY** - Lavender Pink. Miniature to small, rose form double. Medium, upright, dense growth. E-M. (U.S. 1962 - Charles J. Hayes, Virginia Beach, VA).
- CECILIA** – Pink, Small formal double. Moderate bushy growth, E. U.S. 2008 – Camellia Forest Nursery, Chapel Hill, NC).
- CHAMPAGNE SORBET** – Soft Pink. Small to medium, single. Compact, tight, upright growth. (C. sasanqua 'Marie Young' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Justin O'Malley Jones, 'Marion Grove Nursery, Mangrove Mountain, NSW).
- CHARMER** – White edged Pink. Large, single. (U.S. 1950 - McCaskill Gardens, Pasadena, CA).
- CHEOPS** - Pale Lavender Rose Pink. Medium, peony form to formal double. Rapid, upright, pyramidal, dense growth. Australia 1990 - Hilda Rahn, Strong's Road, Jasper's Brush, NSW).
- CHERIE** - Pale Pink. Semidouble to rose form double. E. (U.S. 1953 - McCaskill Gardens, Pasadena, CA).
- CHERILYN** – Pink fading to pale Pink. Medium, peony form. Vigorous growth (Australia 1959 - A.S. McCloy, Pymble, NSW).
- CHERRY BLOSSOM** – White, edge tinged Pink. Miniature Upright, compact growth (U.S. 1948 - Fruitland Nurseries, Augusta, GA).
- CHISATO-NO-AKI (AUTUMN IN VILLAGES)** – White. Medium, peony form. E-M. (Japan 1987 – Kumamoto Prefecture).
- CHOJI GURUMA (Wheel of Anemone)** - Light Pink turning deeper toward edge of petals and petaloids.

Miniature, anemone form.

CICADA – White. Large, informal double (peony form). Average, spreading growth. E-M. (Australia 2001 - Camellia Grove Nursery, Sydney).

CLASSIQUE – Two toned Pink with Yellow Stamens. Medium, formal double. (Australia 2010 - Coachwood Nurseries, Somersby, NSW).

CLEOPATRA - Rose Pink shading to lighter Pink at the center with Yellow anthers. Medium, semidouble. (Japan to U.S. 1929 – K Sawada, Overlook Nursery, Crichton, AL).

CLEOPATRA WHITE - White. Medium, semidouble. (Sport of *C. sasanqua* ‘Cleopatra’). (U.S. 1950 – K Sawada, Overlook Nursery, Crichton, AL).

CLEOPATRA’S BLUSH – Delicate soft Pink. Small. (Sport of *C. sasanqua* ‘Cleopatra’). (U.S. 1956 - McCaskill Gardens Nursery, Pasadena, CA).

COCOANUT ICE – Medium Pink striped White. Small, single. (*C. sasanqua* ‘Onigoromo’ seedling). (Australia 1980 - Alice Spragg, Sutherland, NSW).

COLLEEN - Pink. Medium, single. (U.S. 1953 - McCaskill Gardens, Pasadena, CA).

CONTORTA VARIEGATED – White with hint of Pink at the petal tips. Single. (U.S. – Mark Crawford, Valdosta, GA).

COOLGARDIE STAR - White. Miniature, anemone form to rose form double. Fragrant. (*C. sasanqua* ‘Setsugekka’ x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 1991 - Keith Abbott, Rossmoyne, WA).

COTTON CANDY - (‘Hyman’s Semidouble Pink’) Clear Pink. Large, semidouble with ruffled petals. (U.S. 1955 – Barrio’s Nursery).

COVINGTON - Sport of *C. sasanqua* ‘Narumigata’ (Narumi Bay) - Deeper colored and twisted petals. (U.S. 1952 – Origin unknown)

CREEK - White. Medium, single. Rapid, upright growth. E. (Australia 1989 - Frank Lazzaroni, West Pymble, NSW,).

CRIMSON KING –Deep Crimson with Golden stamens. Large, semidouble. . (Japan 1937)

CRIMSON TIDE - Red. Small, semidouble with ruffled petals. (U.S. 1955 - Tom Dodd, Jr., Semmes, AL).

CURLY – Rich Pink with Yellow anthers and Cream filaments. Small semidouble. Medium to slow, dense, low, spreading growth. E-M. (New Zealand 2007 - Neville. Haydon, Takanini).

DAN’S ALICE - Magenta blooms have a spreading ring of Cream stamens. Small, single; broad petals are crinkled and notched. Medium, upright, bushy growth. E-L. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).

DAN’S AMANDA – White with Pink edge with Yellow anthers and Cream filaments. Medium, single to semidouble. Fast, dense, upright growth. Fragrant.

E-VL. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).

DAN’S ANNEKA – White with pale Lavender edges. Medium, formal double maturing to informal double (peony) or semidouble; petals are broad, smooth and notched Slow, upright, dense, bushy growth. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).

DAN’S ANNE LISE – Pale Pink with Yellow anthers and Creamy White filaments. Medium, broad petals are notched and slightly crinkled. Fast, upright, spreading growth. M–VL. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).

DAN’S AUDREY – Pink petals are twisted and notched, and RHSCC 65A at the center, shading to 65D at the edges. Spreading ring of Yellow filaments and stamens may have occasional petaloids. Medium, semidouble. Medium, spreading vase shaped growth. Fragrant. E-L. (*C. sasanqua* ‘Dan’s Sally’ x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).

DAN’S BRIGITTE – Silvery Pink and have few stamens. Small informal double (peony) with petals irregular, slightly notched and may be wavy, fluted, twisted. Medium, tall, weeping upright, bushy growth. Fragrant. E-L. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).

DAN’S CHLOE – White with occasional Pink edges with Cream stamens in a flared column. Medium, single; petals are broad, reflexed, notched, with crinkled edges. Fast, upright, bushy growth. Fragrant. (*C. sasanqua* ‘Plantation Pink’ x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).

DAN’S CONNIE – White with outer petals having a dark Cerise edge and inner petals a lighter edge with Gold anthers and Cream filaments. Medium, semidouble. Strongly scented. Fast, strong, upright, dense, bushy growth. (*C. sasanqua* ‘Setsugekka’ x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).

DAN’S ELSA – Pale Pink with a silvery sheen and a spreading ring of Yellow stamens. Medium, semidouble; petals are narrow, crinkled, creped, notched and are translucent at the outer edge. Fragrant. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).

DAN’S HANNE – Red moired with a lighter center. Single to semidouble; blooms have broad crinkled and notched petals. Fast, strong bushy upright growth. M–VL. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).

DAN’S HELENA – Pink with sparse spreading ring of Yellow anthers and Cream filaments. Medium, single with long narrow notched petals. Highly

- perfumed. Slow, dense bushy, upright growth. M-L. (C. sasanqua 'Dan's Hanne x unknown pollen parent'). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S JANICE** – White with pale Cerise margins. Medium; petals crinkled and twisted. . Fragrant. Slow to medium dense growth. E-VL. (Australia 1997 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S JESSICA** – White with occasional Pink edges with Yellow anthers and Yellow filaments. Medium, anemone to informal double (peony); petals are irregular and notched. Strongly fragrant. Fast, upright, dense bushy growth. M-L. (C. sasanqua 'Jennifer Susan' x unknown pollen parent'). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S JOAN** – Lavender Pink with spreading ring of Yellow stamens. Large, semidouble; petals irregular, ruffled and crinkled. Medium, upright, dense, bushy growth. E-L. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S JOHANNA** – Cream centered petals shading to Cerise with a flared column of Yellow stamens. Small, semidouble; petals are broad, flat, crinkled, notched. Strongly perfumed. Fast, upright, dense, bushy growth. M-L. (C. sasanqua 'Dan's Hanne' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S KATE** – White flushed Pink, with a Cerise edge with Yellow stamens. Small, single; petals broad, cupped and notched. Highly perfumed. Very slow, compact, bushy growth. E-VL. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S LAUREN** - White, with dark Pink to Lavender edges with Yellow anthers and Cream filaments. Small. Single to semidouble; Petals are irregular, notched, ruffled and creped. Fragrant. M-L. (C. sasanqua 'Plantation Pink' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S MARY** - White to pale Pink center, with petals edged completely around with Purplish Pink (RHS.CC.66C) with Gold anthers and Yellow filaments. Miniature, single to semidouble; broad flat and creped petals. Slow, dense, short, stocky growth. Slightly fragrant . M-L. (C. sasanqua 'Setsugekka' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S MELANIE** - White to very Pale Pink at the centre, shading to Dark Pink or Cerise at the edges with flared column of Cream stamens with a split pistil. Medium, single. Highly perfumed. Fast, upright bushy growth; petals are broad, rounded, slightly incurved and creped at the edges. M-L. (C. sasanqua 'Dan's Alice' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S META** – White with occasional Pink on reverse of petals with Golden anthers and Yellow stamens; broad petals are also incurved, creped and notched. Medium, upright, dense, bushy growth. E-L. (C. sasanqua 'Setsugekka' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S NATALIE** - Pink fading to Silvery Pink at the center. Small, informal double (peony); petals are broad, irregular, notched and stamens are multi-clustered and dispersed among the petaloids. Medium, upright growth. E-L. (C. sasanqua 'Dan's Hanne' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S NINA** - Porcelain Pink with a fine Paler Pink to White edge with Golden anthers and Yellow filaments. Miniature, single; petals are incurved and notched. Fragrant. Medium, dense, spreading growth. M-L. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S REBECCA** - Shell Pink (RHS.CC.66D) with a darker Cerise center. Medium informal double (peony); petals are irregular, broad and notched and stamens are multi-clustered and dispersed. M-L. (C. sasanqua 'Dan's Hanne' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S SALLY** – Pastel Pink (RHSCC 62B) with Gold anthers and Creamy Yellow filaments. Medium, single. Medium, spreading, dense growth. Fragrant. E-L. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S SUSANNE** – Very dark Silvery Pink (RHSCC 66B) with Golden anthers and White filaments. Medium, single with broad, creped, reflexed and notched petals. Fast, upright, bushy growth. Fragrant. E-L. (C. sasanqua 'Dan's Joan' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S TOMMELISE** – Very dark Pink to Red sometimes with a splash of White. Miniature, anemone form. Very slow, spreading, weeping growth. Fragrant. E-L. (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAN'S ZOE** – Lavender Pink with Cream filaments. Small, semidouble; petals are wavy and slightly notched. Fast, spreading, bushy growth. Fragrant. M-L. (C. sasanqua 'Jennifer Susan' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Kurt Boesen, Dancraft Nurseries, Wilberforce, NSW).
- DAYDAWN BELLE** - Pink. Miniature, semidouble to rose form double. Rapid, upright free flowering

- growth. E-M. (Australia 1992 - Keith Abbott, Rossmoyne, WA).
- DAYDREAM** - White edged deep Rose Pink with light buff tipped Yellow stamens. Large, single. Vigorous growth. Very fragrant. E. (U.S. 1948-1949 - Mobile Ornamental Nursery, AL).
- DAYDREAM BELIEVER** - Pure White. Medium, single. Fast, upright growth. Fragrant. E. (U.S. 2000 - Bobby Green, Green Nurseries, Fairhope, AL).
- DEAN'S DELIGHT** - Pale Pink with light Pink tips. Semidouble to peony form. E-L. (U.S. - Roscoe Dean, Lucedale, MS).
- DIANNA** - White with Yellow stamens. M.
- DOUBLE CHERRY** - Bright Cherry Red. Large, semidouble to informal double (peony). Vigorous, upright growth. E-M. (C. sasanqua 'Paradise Belinda' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Justin O'Malley Jones, Marian Grove Nursery, Mangrove Mountain, NSW).
- DOUBLE RAINBOW** - White bordered Rose Red. Small to medium, semidouble. (U.S.)
- DREAMLOVER** - White center with a deep Lavender Pink edge. Medium, semidouble. Fast, upright growth. (C. sasanqua 'Jane Morgan' x unknown pollen parent). (Australia 2010 - Roger Nancarrow, Orange, NSW).

HIRYU-NISHIKI - Crimson splashed White. Rose form double. (Japan to U.S. 1934-1939– E. A. McIlhenny, Avery Island, LA)

HOSHI-HIRYU - Crimson dotted White. (Sport of *C. vernalis* 'Hiryu'). (Japan to U.S. 1934-1939 – E. A. McIlhenny, Avery Island, LA)

KAMAKURA-SHIBORI - Red with White blotches with Golden anthers and Yellow filaments Small, single. (Japan).

KYO-NISHIKI - White striped Pink. Single.

RED BIRD - See 'HIRYU'.

SHIBORI-EGAO (Variegated Smiling Face) - Variegated form of 'Egao'. Deep Rose blotched White. Median to large.

SCARLET BIRD - See 'Hiryu'

SCARLET DRAGON - See 'Hiryu'

STAR ABOVE STAR- White center shading to Lavender Rose at edge. Medium, semidouble in the form of one star superimposed on another star. Vigorous, upright, bushy growth. M. (*C. vernalis* 'Ginryû' x unknown pollen parent). (U.S. 1964 - McCaskill Gardens, Pasadena, CA)

WINIFRED HILLS – Red-Purple. Medium, anemone. Rapid, upright, dense growth. (*C. vernalis* 'Hiryu' x unknown pollen parent). (New Zealand 1970 – W. Hills, Whakatane).
