From the Editor — The editor's page is replaced in this issue by a memorial to Milton H. Brown, Executive Director of the American Camellia Society, recently deceased.

Milton Henry Brown

January 9, 1916 — April 9, 1986 From *The Leader-Tribune*, Fort Valley, Georgia

Colonel Milton H. Brown of Church Street in Fort Valley died Wednesday, April 9, 1986, in a Birmingham, Alabama, hospital after a brief illness. A memorial service was held at Fort Valley Presbyterian Church on Saturday, April 12, at 11:00 a.m. with interment services in Portsmouth, Virginia, at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 13.

A native of Troy, New York, Mr. Brown graduated from Pittsburgh University and obtained his M.A. degree at George Washington University. He had been a graduate student at National War College in Washington,

D.C.
A veteran of World War II, Mr. Brown served in the Pacific theater and received the Silver Star. He later served in the Army intelligence before joining the Central Intelligence Agency. During his service with the CIA he was awarded a Presidential Citation for excellence. During the last three years of his government employment he served as Attache for the State Department at the U.S. Embassy in London.

Retiring from government service in 1973, he was appointed as Executive Secretary of the American Camellia Society. In this capacity he undertook extensive travel, including a "Goodwill Educational" trip to China within the past two years.

Mr. Brown was a Life Member of the American Camellia Society and past Vice-President of the International Camellia Society: a member of the Chamber of Commerce and the Fort Valley Kiwanis Club. He belonged to the Boehm Collectors Guild and the Garden Writers' Association of America. Mr. Brown was a Director of the Andersonville Trail Association and President of the Georgia Historic Heartland Travel Association. He was chairman of the funding drive for the addition to the Thomas Public Library and an elder of the Fort Valley Presbyterian Church.

Survivors include his wife, Ann Brown; his daughter, Blair Brown; and his grandson, Robert Jordan.

In lieu of flowers the family requested that contributions be made to the American Camellia Society or to a favorite charity.

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Directors on Thursday, May 22, 1986

The meeting was held at 5567 N. Burton Avenue, San Gabriel, California, and was called to order at 7:10 P.M. by Pres Bracci. The other members present were Jerry Biewend, Chuck Gerlach, John Utvich, Dave Wood, Melvin Belcher, Warren Dick-

son, and Julius Christinson.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. A treasurer's report stated that the checking account has a balance of \$1,346.00 and that the outstanding obligations include \$1,800.00 to the Printer, \$900.00 to the Camellia Nomenclature Fund, \$500.00 to the Secretary, and about \$200.00 to petty cash, leaving a shortage of \$2,054.00. Dave Wood was asked if the printer should be paid in part payments, and he said that it was all right to wait until the treasury could make the total payment.

Pres Bracci said that several things now in the planning stage would help the treasury meet its obligations, such as the Caryll Pitkin letter requesting support for the *Camellia Review* Fund, and the luau in August and with it the raffle and other accompanying activi-

ties.

Officers elected for the coming year were Sergio Bracci, President; Chuck Gerlach, Vice-President; Warren Dickson, Secretary-Treasurer; Milton Schmidt, Foreign Representative; and Glenn Smith, Editor of the *Review*.

Pres Bracci asked that all of the previous year appointed officers carry on for another year. He also asked Mel Belcher to present the awards at the

Summer Picnic.

Pres Bracci announced that the Summer Picnic will be on June 7, 1986. He then stated that the liability insurance at Descanso Gardens prohibited the use of the Hospitality House for the picnic but that the Georgia Van De Kamp. Hall will be used.

His conclusion was that this would work out to more comfortable access and parking for the members. He said that he had been required to pay the Descanso Guild \$51.00 for the liability insurance for the picnic as well as \$15.00 for the privilege of having wine, and also 75¢ postage charge for the processes.

Further statements regarding the Summer Picnic were: Mel Belcher will get crushed ice, a consensus to serve punch instead of sodas (in the interest of economy), Sergio will pick up the plants, the set-up for the picnic will begin at 4:00 P.M. as requested by Pres Bracci, although Chuck and Sergio

will arrive there earlier.

John Utvich reported that he had moved \$14,833.91 in the Camellia Nomenclature Fund from an account bearing 7.10% interest to an account bearing 7.836% interest, and that he had deposited \$100.00 into an account on a withdrawal basis, to which he has already added \$40.00.

Dave Wood stated that the cost of the 1987 Edition, the Nineteenth Revised Edition, of Camellia Nomenclature will cost between \$11,000.00 and \$12,000.00, and that the outside cost

would not exceed the latter.

Elsie Bracci was requested to participate in the discussion of the luau which is to take place on August 9, 1986, in the Braccis' garden. The following statements were made regarding the luau: that it would begin at 4:00 PM (or maybe between 4:00 and 5:00 PM); that the dinner would be at 6:30 PM; that the dinner would be priced at \$7.50; that drinks would be 50¢ for sodas, \$1.00 for wine, and \$1.50 for mixed drinks; that script would be sold in 50¢ denominations for the drinks; that donations for raffle tickets would be \$1.00; that there would be a beginning need for 1,500 raffle tickets, and Dave Wood said that Wood & Jones would print them at no cost to SCCS and would print more later if needed: that Julius Christinson will be able to get some Hawaiian dance entertainers; that Julius Christinson will bring tables from his location; that John Utvich has benches for use at the luau; that Jerry Biewend and Julius Christinson will bring chairs; that Sergi will be in charge of getting alcoholic beverages; that tables and chairs would be delivered on Friday, August 8; that there would be need on Saturday morning for help both in the kitchen in preparing food and in the garden for the set-up of table and chairs; and the Board was unanimous in accepting the suggestion of Helen Perigan as presented by Elsie Bracci for a 'silent auction' and in accepting the request for items to be donated for the 'silent auction'

Chuck Gerlach said he would like to make a donation to SCCS of the \$65.00 expenses incurred for the Summer Picnic announcements.

Wilkins Garner by Pat Greutert

The tiny Korean grandmother who lives next-door to Wilkins Garner frequently stands on tiptoe to peer over the fence while Wilkie works in his garden.

"Hi!" she says, using the only En-

glish word she knows.

Often she waves a roll of bills at Wilkie and points to a seedling camellia or a potted azalea. Wilkie usually hands her the pot for nothing if it's a seedling, or buys her one at the nursery if it's something he doesn't want to part with. As a result of Wilkie's kindness, the little lady's Oriental-type garden flourishes and Wilkie has made another friend.

His wife Marian states: "Everyone loves Wilkie. I never heard him say ugly things about anyone in the 57

years we've been married."

Therein lies a little of Wilkie's tremendous value to camellia societies. His tactful ways and philosophical attitude have prevented many situations from erupting into discord between members or societies. Wilkie loves camellias, but his greatest pleasure comes from knowing and working with the people who grow them.

Wilkie's interest in camellias took some time to surface. Born in Ecru, Mississippi, a town of 600 people (which it still is), he spent an idyllic childhood learning to fish and hunt and ride horseback with his father, and playing with his three younger brothers.


In 1910, 10-year-old Wilkie saw his first automobile and by 1915 he was behind the wheel. His father had the general store in Ecru, was a cotton buyer and also on the bank board of directors in Pontotoc, Mississippi. Since he didn't drive, it was a great convenience to have Wilkie chauffeur him to board meetings.

As Wilkie, sometimes called Slim, grew — and grew — and grew, he developed an Abe Lincoln look — high cheekbones, broad shoulders and a lanky frame. Now, when he sits in a chair, his knees rise like mountains in front of him. He doesn't just stand up, he unfurls.

In 1925 he graduated from Mississippi State University with an accounting degree. Interestingly for camellia growers, his first job was working as an accountant for a milling company which manufactured cottonseed meal, a favorite camellia fertilizer.

A year later Aetna Life and Casualty hired him to be a field auditor. They kept him on for 38 years. He established a reputation as a trouble-shooter who rescued many depression-shattered businesses connected with Aetna. He also became familiar with most of the crack trains covering the eastern seaboard.

Then Wilkie's travels took him to



Dallas where he rented a room from two nice ladies whose lovely niece, Marian Milam, lived down the street with her parents. According to Wilkie, on February 9, 1929 the aunts took him to meet their relatives. As they all sat in the living room listening to Victrola music Wilkie asked Marian to dance. Behind the sofa, out of sight, Wilkie held Marian close and kissed her.

Startled, Marian stepped back and asked, "Why did you do that?"

Wilkie, eyes twinkling, replied, "Why wouldn't I? You're a mighty pretty girl."

Obviously Marian liked his reply for the two soon married. Wilkie retains that twinkle.

The pair spent ten years of married life moving from one hotel to another and one apartment after another. Finally, they landed in Los Angeles for what looked like an extended stay. Marian persuaded Wilkie to build a home with a yard where their 2-year-old daughter, Ann, could play.

Wilkie recalls, "I bought the smallest lot I could find, on Highland Avenue in Glendale, and built the house.

"More interested in golf than gardenng, I told Marian she could buy two plants to put in the yard and that was all"

Marian's two Dallas aunts, originally from Natchez, Mississippi, often spoke of the "camellias japonica" they had had while living there. Admiring her aunts' good taste, Marian decided those two plants Wilkie allowed her should be "camellias japonica."

They visited Coolidge Rare Plants Gardens in Altadena where Vern Mc-Caskill sold them a Pink Perfection and a similar rose-colored flower called Romany. Those two camellias still thrive on the Garners' former property.

Of course, those first camellias stoked the Garners' interest and, when Vern and his wife Billie opened Mc-Caskill Camellia Gardens in Pasadena, the four became good friends, and the Garners, good customers. At Vern's suggestion they joined Pacific Camellia Society when it met at the News Press Building (now Bank of America) on Glendale's Brand Boulevard.

Soon active, not only in Pacific, but also in the Southern California Camellia Society and the Southern California Camellia Council, Wilkie served as president of each at various times. He utilized his accounting experience working as treasurer and fundraiser, keeping the societies on sound financial footing. He judged flowers at the shows and served on boards of directors as he still does.

Marian remembers well the American Camellia Society Convention in 1971. Wilkie was hospitality chairman for the event and they served dinner for 27 people in their home.

Wilkie recalls two accomplishments with special pride. The first was bringing three active members into the societies: Al Parker, John Robinson and the late Lon Storey. The second can be found in *Camellia Nomenclature*, first page. A little phrase reads "Adopted As The Official Book Of The American Camellia Society." Wilkie worked with Bill Woodruff, then book's editor, corresponding with Aubrey Harris, then president of ACS, to have the book accepted officially. That move has brought unity into the once chaotic area of camellia names and identifica-

tion. The book is now accepted as a standard by camellia growers the world over.

In recognition of his outstanding contributions, the Southern California Camellia Society elected Wilkins Garner an honorary life member.

One more laurel awaits Wilkie. Since he and Marian bought their present Glendale home on El Rito Avenue in 1957, they have worked perfecting their lovely garden. Each has a bailiwick; Marian specializes in houseplants and ferns while Wilkie takes care of the azaleas, orchids, hollies and prize-winning camellias. Hidden around the garden perimeter are Wilkie's pots of camellia seedlings. In 1973 he registered Redbud, a deep red miniature, but it never was commercially propagated. Lately, however, he exhibited another seedling at one of the shows. Julius Nuccio spotted the red, fragrant, anemone-type flower — a japonica — and asked to propagate it for famed Nuccio's Nurseries. Named Mariann, after Wilkie's wife Marian and daughter Ann, the flower will be ready for distribution in 1987 or 88.

Two "camellias japonica" marked a crossroads for Wilkins Garner. He never became a luminary on the golf course, he opted instead for a camellia hobby which has filled his life with lots of work, beautiful flowers and many appreciative friends.

The Camellia Nomenclature Book

The 19th Revised Edition of CAMELLIA NOMENCLATURE which is published by the Southern California Camellia Society will be off the press on October 1, 1986. This book, which is updated every three years, has been the "bible" of the camellia world since it was first published in 1947. It is presented as a gift to all paid-up members of the Southern California Camellia Society and is sold to other camellia societies and to individuals throughout the world. The printing of the 19th Revised Edition is being authorized at 2,500 copies and it will be released on a first come, first served basis.


